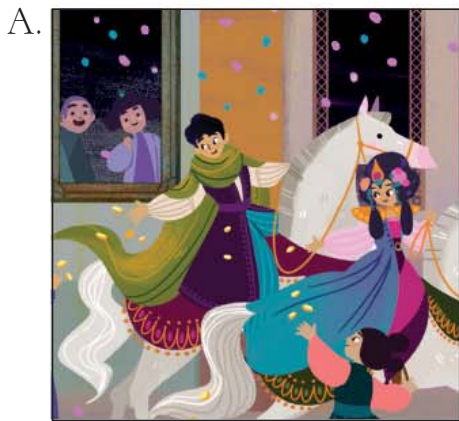

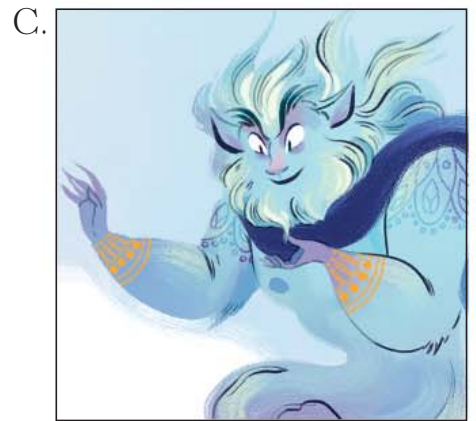

A blue genie appeared. He was twice as big as the first genie.



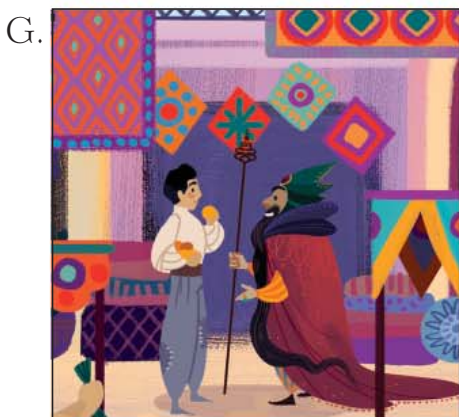
They had lots of children, and in time, Aladdin became Emperor.

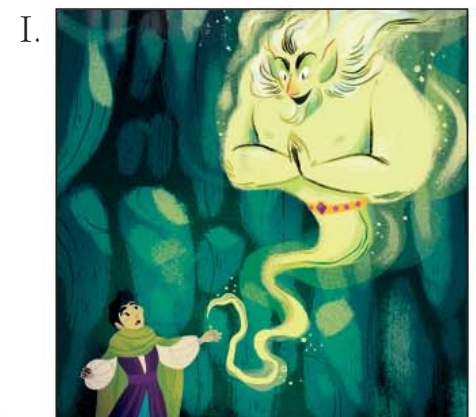
